June 21 our loved ones and friends departed on the great adventure to look for the remains of Amelia Earhart. Barbara and I are starting a newsletter to keep you all informed as much as possible and give you the history of what it has taken to get our teams there as well as the history about the island and other past efforts to find Amelia.

Since we're trying to get the information out as quickly as possible, you may find the occasional typos or errors. Please forgive our mistakes.

Our job is to support and comfort you, the friends and family staying at home. I understand it's a little worrisome that we will not have easy phone and email contact for a while. We have gotten so accustomed to being able to communicate at any time, it's hard to not be in touch.

John has a device called inReach that is able to send a message that they are ok along with their location via satellite. They can also send a short text message if needed for an emergency. But basically we will not have a daily connection with what they are doing after they board the ship. We will refer to a basic agenda that has been made up for daily activities.
